

Raymond M. and Bernadine L. Griggs moved to Grimes in 1951. They moved the Purdue school house from Dallas County to 305 N Main St.





His son Frank, a Navy career man, is living in Orlando, Florida, with his wife Janet and their two daughters, Machelle and Tiffany.



Land was selling for \$5.00 per acre. His father acquired nearly 1000 acres in the area. The

land values were based on the number of trees and the worth of the timber.

John married Lucinda Smith from Saylorville and to this union were born three children. Charles Hufford and Mary Shumaker, both deceased and Jessie Bohrofen.

He operated a store in Grimes for 34 years, including groceries, hardward, furniture, and even undertaking, along with farming for many years.


His life history reads of transforming Iowa from a land of ponds, swamps and mud roads into fertile fields and highways.







David has been employed with HyVee Stores since graduating from ISU. His employment has taken him to Ames, Austin, Minnesota, and now in Des Moines.


Brenda is a housewife. She is active with Fourth Grade Girl Scouts and Aldersgate Methodist Church.






Mrs. Kohls was known far and wide for her help in time of sickness.

Fredrick and Ernestine farmed until they moved to Grimes, where Fredrick died in 1913. Ernestine passed away in 1916, aged 84.




August and Lesetta (Wipperman) Knoll were a well-known farm couple of Grant Twp. August immigrated


